MAP Assessment

I have attached the results of our spring MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) results. You will notice that most goals were met in reading and language arts, but not in math. Where math received stronger scores on Iowa Assessment, but MAP data did not necessarily agree. We will use this MAP data along with Iowa Assessment data to structure our RTI (Response to Intervention) groups for next year.

Mrs. Frese met with the middle school staff on May 1st to show specific MAP reports that breakdown the results into more specific areas. This will allow teachers to key in on specific areas with groups of students.
