## Elementary School Board Report April 17, 2023

The Elementary Raffle was a HUGE success. We raised approximately \$27,000 between ticket sales and monetary donations from local businesses. Every elementary teacher will receive money for their classroom and each grade level will receive money to be used for field trips and PBIS quarterly parties. We plan to continue having a TRIBE store at each grade level for students PK-4. They will be able to purchase different items with the TRIBE tickets earned for positive behavior. A huge thank you to all of the businesses that gave monetary donations and/or raffle prizes.

The preschoolers had a wonderful time visiting the Phelps Youth Pavilion! Students were able to interact with manipulatives in 3 different stations. "Around the World" students were able to put on a play, build with oversized materials, and play in homes of various cultures. "Back in Time" students could ride a time machine, milk a cow by hand, and play in a one room schoolhouse. "Dino World" students could dig for fossils, climb a volcano, and play with an interactive floor game. It was a great hands-on experience for everyone!

3rd and 4th graders have explored the ISASP practice tests and are reading to take their assessments this week. They will also be completing the Conditions for Learning survey. Staff and parents are also invited to take the survey.

We had our Preschool Open House last month and currently have 38 3 year olds and 51 4 year olds preregistered. We've also taken a lot of calls regarding the before and after school care that will be at the elementary through Little Sprouts next year.

We earned \$2715.43 from the spring elementary book fair. This means we were able to get 237 new books for our libraries along with new STEM items from Scholastic. We had an amazing turn out from our community and parents supporting the book fair!
