- 1. Second round of testing with FAST assessment is complete, any student following below proficiency on the assessment in the fall and with the winter testing will be identified as needing intensive interventions. Parents must be notified (contract attached) and will be handed out at conferences and explained. Our intensive intentions numbers are: TK-12, K-1, 1-11, 2-15, 3-33, 4-30 =102 students who need services and they will start with Fast ForWord this week.
- 2. Literacy teachers will be meeting on February 13th at Turkey Valley with surrounding districts on how we are approaching the ELI law and what we have in place and what they are doing. Districts are very concerned with some of the webinars taking place, guidance we have been provided, etc.
- 3. Attended training on Jan. 28th with Dr. Updegraff on Standards Based Grading within Powerschool at GWAEA in Cedar Rapids. We will be taking a group of teachers March 16th to AEA to hear about how to get started with an implementation plan.
- 4. Teachers are really trying to implement APL strategies within their rooms and like the training they received in January.
