

1. Kwik Star Fundraiser - The focus in the past has been to purchase team games/activities the students could play within their homerooms. Students have been doing a great job keeping these items in good shape and they still get used at the end of the day during Tribe Time. This year we plan to take trips again to enhance our learning opportunities, trips have been planned for Norman Borlaug Inspire day, Mississippi Riverfront Museum, Twin Ponds, etc. In 2021, we sold almost \$100,000 dollars in Kwik Star cards, our goal last year was to get above that mark of \$100,000 and the kids demolished that by selling over \$140,000 dollars in cards. Who knows where they will want to set the bar this year. Cards can be used directly at the pump so that has been beneficial. This year the goal is to sell October 30 - November 10, so a check can be approved at the November school board meeting and cards can be ordered and passed out in December. This fundraiser has been successful netting upwards to \$7500 for the middle school to use on these various learning opportunities.
2. Homecoming Festivities are being planned by our CLT (Chickasaw Leadership Team. Students have been working with coordinating dress up days, planning our assembly fun, and other spirited games that can be included throughout our instructional day. Last year Students had fun at the beginning of the day trying to gather Chickasaw spirit for a prize in the office.

3. Teachers began the fall screeners for aMath and aReading, and have administered the level set for Achieve3000 this allows teachers to talk amongst their grade level plc's in making sure students are in the best fit intervention. We will talk more about interventions during October's professional development as the 6 week mark for our first round of interventions will be 10/16. Checking to make sure progress is happening is important as we push all students to achieve their highest potential.
4. IXL Science was purchased to go along with reading and math. Mrs. Rodgers has been using it as an extended learning tool with her 7th grade students who have answered 8,261 questions so far this year. IXL has been great for student engagement also outside the classroom as 54 hours have been spent on the program outside of the school to go along with the 398.5 hours during the school day. Students have answered around 71,000 questions this year thus far and have mastered 1388 skills.
