Vote for New Hampton School Board District No. 2 for a term of four (4) years. Damian Baltes received Three hundred sixty-nine (369) votes. Jennifer Heying received Seventy-seven (77) votes. There was a scattering of Zero (0) votes. Therefore; Damian Baltes was duly elected for the office of New Hampton School Board Director District No. 2 for the term of four (4) years. Vote for New Hampton School Board District at large for a term of four (4) years. Timothy Denner received Four hundred one (401) votes. There was a scattering of Six (6) votes for a total of Four hundred seven (407) votes. Therefore; Timothy Denner was duly elected for the office of New Hampton School Board Director at large for the term of four (4) years.
