Peanut Butter Drive

New Hampton Elementary has chosen to host the second annual peanut butter drive for the BackPack Program of the Northeast Iowa Food Bank as part of our December caring project. Students and community members can bring in regular-size jars of peanut butter beginning December 2nd and ending December 20th. Jars of peanut butter may also be brought to the Holiday Program on the 9th and placed under the Christmas tree. All jars of peanut

butter collected will remain local.

The goal of the BackPack Program is to send shelf-stable, kid-friendly and healthy foods home with children for the weekend. These foods may be prepared easily and consumed when parents are working and cannot prepare meals for their children, or when there simply is not enough food at home for the children to eat. Studies have shown that students perform better in school when they eat three balanced meals each day. This program ensures that children come to school alert and ready to learn.

NHEs Backpack Program

Nineteen families representing twenty-eight NHE students have applied for the Backpack Program. This is up from nineteen children last year. We have a few applications out right now so expect the number of children getting backpacks to increase. The food for the backpacks is delivered by the Northeast Iowa Food Pantry to fill the backpacks. Each student takes home a backpack containing about six pounds of food every Friday, which will hopefully include a jar of peanut butter for the rest of the year, due to our caring project for December. The BackPack Program provides backpacks of food to low-income children at the end of the school week to combat weekend hunger.
