5 pound container of cottage cheese w/ 4% milk fat

5 pound container of low fat flavored yogurt

4-6 ounce carton of 1% fruit flavored fat free yogurt (ie: strawberry, blueberry, etc.)

16 oz vending milk (chocolate, white, strawberry, etc.) fat free and 1% varieties

The Board of Education will make the final decision at their regularly scheduled July, 2017 meeting. ESCALATOR CLAUSE

FLUID MILK PRODUCTS:

The prices in this bid are based on the Class I price (at 3.5% butterfat) plus premiums. The Class I price is established under the terms of the Central Federal Milk Market Order #32. The price established for the month of June 2017 is \$19.91 per 100 lbs. The components of this price include: Class I Skim Price - \$7.34/cwt.; Class I Butterfat Price - \$2.3492/lb; Location Adjustment - \$1.80/cwt.; Premiums - \$2.80/cwt.

The formula for price adjustments of fluid milk delivered in half-pint and all other size containers is as follows:

- a. Compute the difference per hundredweight for Class I milk between the price for the month in question and the price for the base month indicated above (or the most recent month in which prices were adjusted) based on the factors relating to the actual cost of each product. Actual cost for each product is determined as follows:

 (Skim factor) * (Skim price) + (Butterfat factor) * (Butterfat price) + Location adjustment + Premiums. Skim factors/Butterfat factors are as follows: Whole milk .9665/3.35; 2% milk .9800/2.00; 1% milk .9900/1.00; Skim milk .9995/.05.
- b. Multiply this difference per hundredweight by .086 (8.6 / 100 8.6 lbs.) to each gallon of milk) to calculate the difference in price per gallon.
- c. One-sixteenth of this difference is the amount of change in price for each one-half pint container of milk. All other size containers will be proportional.
- d. If the price for Class I milk is higher during the month in question than in the base month, the sum will be added to the previous price charged by the vendor. If the price for Class I milk is lower during the month in question than in the base month, the sum will be deducted from the previous price charged by the vendor.

Milk Escalator / De-Escalator Pricing Clause

The pricing quoted is based on the current month's (JUNE 2017) Federal Milk Marketing Order for Class I Skim and Class I Butterfat. This pricing is subject to change as the cost of raw milk changes each month according to the USDA Federal Milk Market Price Announcements and changes in over order premium charges.

The cost of milk fluctuates up and down each month based on the cost changes in raw milk. Changes are based on CMPC announced class 1 Skim and Class 1 announced butterfat.

- ½ pint whole = ([(Skim change *8.3205)/100] +[(Butterfat change *0.2795)/100])/16
- $\frac{1}{2}$ pint 2% = ([(Skim change*8.4476)/100] + [(Butterfat change*0.1794)/100])/16
- $\frac{1}{2}$ pint 1% = ([(Skim change *8.5338)/100] + [(Butterfat change *0.0862)/100])/16
- ½ pint Skim= ([(Skim change*8.6214/100] +[(Butterfat change *0.0086)/100])/16

Prices will also be adjusted up or down based on cost changes in packaging, ingredients, labor, fuel, juice concentrate, re-sale products, and any other manufacturing and distribution related expenses. Supporting documentation will be supplied upon request.
